
Did you know there are over 10 million different colours identified?





To help us understand colours better, we organise them into different groups. This helps us to chose different colours that compliment eachother when we are creating works of art.

Do you know what the 3 primary colours are?




These are our primary colours!




Do you know what the secondary colours are?



Here are the secondary colours!




Can you point to the secondary and primary colours on the colour wheel?




Finally, we have tertiary colours.

Secondary Colours




Tertiary Colours


Here you can see how we mix colours together to create new colours.

This term our art focus is collage.

Do you know what a collage is?

A collage is...

a piece of art made by sticking various different materials such as photographs and pieces of paper or fabric on to a backing.

Here are some examples of collage:





Your independent task this week is to make your own collage!

Interestingly, to create art we don't always need art supplies.

For this project you will need:

- A piece of paper or cardboard as your base (this could be the side of a cereal box)
- A pencil
- Some recycled materials such as magazines, crisp packets, sweet packets, cereal boxes etc.
- Some glue (don't worry if you do not have any you can still complete the task)
- Scissors

Your task:

I would like you to choose a colour and create a collage of a fish using this colour.

You can use crisp packets, cereal boxes and other recycled materials. Cut them into small shapes and arrange them on your base to create the shape of a fish.

Using your knowledge of colours, use 2 colours that blend together nicely.
